LIST OF DATES & SYNOPSIS

The erstwhile Municipal Corporation of Delhi provided for cashless medical facility to its retired teachers/employees.

2012-The Corporation was bifurcated into three namely, South, North and East DMCs with a common Health Department for all three Corporations. The Corporations, has taken subscription premium from the retired teachers and employees for extending cashless medical facility.

2020-Despite the retired employees having deposited the premium the Corporations are yet to extend to them the cashless medical facility. The employees are required to first report to the Health Department and after obtaining the referral from the Department they can seek medical treatment from the approved Hospital. Not only this, if the approved Hospital advises surgery the retired employee is required to revert back to the Health Department for approval and only then, the actual treatment will start. In emergency cases such a procedure is not only cumbersome but also likely to prove fatal. The problem does not end here. The Hospitals do not provide cashless treatment. The employees have to deposit money first and seek reimbursement from the Health Department of MCD later which takes a huge time. This act of the M.C.D is

absolutely unfair and illegal. During this Corona Virus Pandemic period a large number of retired employees who did not receive pension on time had to face extreme hardships in arranging money for their treatment as the Hospitals did not provide cashless treatment. The petitioner no.2 in the present case got his wife treated for heart ailment in BLK super Speciality Hospital in Delhi on 8-9-2020 and had to arrange Rs.1,39,000/- to pay to the Hospital for treatment of his wife as she had suffered heart attack on 7-9-2020. He had deposited Rs.39,000/- as premium in 2010 on his retirement. He was issued Identity Card for cashless medical facility by the Corporation and yet he had to pay money to the Hospital. The medical bill submitted by him to the South DMC is yet to be reimbursed to him. He, however, is not the only sufferer there are many other retired employees running from office to office to get reimbursement of their medical bills which the three Corporations have kept pending under various objections.

Petitioners, therefore, seek this Hon'ble Court's kind indulgence in the matter so that the cashless medical facility is extended to the retired teachers/employees of MCD.

A WRIT PETITION IN PUBLIC INTEREST UNDER ARTICLE 226-R/W ARTICLES 14 AND 21 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF INDIA FOR ISSUANCE OF AN APPROPRIATE WRIT/ DIRECTION/ORDER IN THE NATRUE OF MANDAMOUS DIRECTING THE RESONDENTS TO PROVIDE CASHLESS MEDICAL SERVICES TO THE RETIRED TEACHERS/EMPLOYEES AND FURTHER DIRECTION TO THE RESPONDENTS TO REIMBURSE THE PENDING BILLS ON ACCOUNT OF MEDICAL TREATMENT.

Hon'ble the Chief Justice and His Lordship's companion justices of Hon'ble the High Court of Delhi

The humble petition of the petitioner above-named

MOST RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

- 1. That the petitioners state that they have no personal interest in the matter and that the petition is not guided by the motive of self-gain or for gain of any other Person/Institution/Body and that there is no motive other than of public interests in filing the present writ petition.
- 2. That the petitioner no.1 is a registered body of Teachers in Delhi and is very much active in acting in furtherance of interest of teachers and students. Recently, petitioner filed W.P.(C) No.3394/2020 for direction to pay the salary of teachers working under the North DMC. The petition was dismissed in limine against which petitioner filed LPA No.158/2020, which has been suo motu converted into PIL and numbered as W.P.(C) No.3833/2020. The North Delhi Municipal Corporation has not paid pension to the retired teachers for the last four months. The

petitioner has filed WP (C) No.5533/2020. The pension for the month of April was paid on 6-10-2020 despite the order of this. Hon'ble Court. The South DMC and East DMC have also not been paying pension on time, as a result of which the retired teachers some of whom are at advance age are facing enormous difficulties in meeting their expenses. Additionally, the retired teachers and employees of all three M.C.Ds are not being provided with cashless medical services despite collecting subscription from them. Since, the Corporations have not paid the bills of the approved/empanelled hospitals, the retired employees of the Corporation have been facing extreme difficulties in getting medical treatment. Since, their pension is not released on time their difficulties get aggravated. It is significant to state here that as pension has not been released to them since May, 2020 the retired employees are undergoing extreme difficulties and are forced to depend upon their children.

It is, further significant to state here that even the procedure adopted for treatment in approved hospitals is cumbersome. In every case the patient has to obtain referral from the Health Department of MCD for treatment in the hospital. Moreover, if the hospital advises surgery or any other major medical act the patient is required to relate back to the Health Department for approval and only then, the patient is treated. In emergency cases such a procedure is bound to result in fatality. For an instance, petitioner no.2 Shri Giriraj Sharma retired as Principal from the Education Department of MCD in 2010. He deposited Rs.39,000/- as subscription money for cashless medical relief which is evident

from the receipt dt.4-8-2010 (Annexure P1). He was issued Identity Card dt.4-8-2010 (Annexure P2) valid up to life time. Now, in 2020 his wife suffered heart attack in September, 2020 on account of which she required urgent medical treatment. Petitioner no.2 could not go to the Hospital approved directly; he had to seek referral from the Health Department of MCD. He got the referral slip on 7-9-2020 where after, he consulted BLK Super Speciality Hospital, Pusa Road, New Delhi. The doctor advised placing of stents in heart for which the petitioner could not give his nod by himself. He had to revert back to the Health Department of Municipal Corporations of Delhi and then the patient was treated on 8-9-2020. The Hospital, however, did not provide her cashless medical treatment. The petitioner ran back to MCD for immediate help but without any result. Finally, the petitioner had to deposit Rs.1,39,563/- for treatment of his wife, which is evident from the bill dt.8-9-2020 (Annexure P3). For this purpose the petitioner had to seek financial help from his friend and his son.

3. That the petitioners submit that the present writ petition is for the benefit of a large number of retired teachers and employees of the MCDs who are either individually litigating on the issue or are in the process of filing litigation for reimbursement of medical bills. The bills are kept pending by the Corporation for months raising myriad objections which defeats the purpose of cashless medical treatment. The Delhi Govt. provides cashless medical treatment to its employees which is actually cashless. Under MCD the retired employees are being forced to spend their own money and thereafter run from pillar to post to get the reimbursement of

money. This practice being followed by the MCD is not actually cashless.

- 4. That the respondents likely to be affected by the orders sought in the writ petition have been impleaded as respondents. The petitioners state that to their knowledge, no other persons/bodies/institutions are likely to be affected by the orders sought in the writ petition.
- 5. That the petitioners state that it is an association of teachers registered under the Societies Registration Act, with its office address at Akhil Dilli Prathmik Shikshak Sangh (Regd.) A Representative body of the Primary School, Teachers in Delhi, through, its General Secretary R.C. Dabas at Jagdish Mishra Shikshak Bhawan, 41, Institutional Area, D- Block, Janakpuri, New Delhi -58 and it has the means to pay the costs, if any imposed by the court and it undertakes to pay the same.
- 6. That the Municipal Corporation of Delhi follows the rules and regulations of the Government of N.C.T, Delhi. Presently, it is divided into three parts namely, SDMC, NDMC and EDMC. It has its own source of revenue through property tax etc. and other municipal taxes and for other things it is dependent upon aids from the Government of NCT, Delhi. There is a common Health Department for all three MCDs.
- 7. That the petitioners have submitted several representations including the one dt.26-12-2019 (ANNEXURE P4) and staged dharna and demonstration for regular payment of salary, pension on time and provision of cashless medical service but their effort

has not paid any dividend. In fact, the petitioners have come to know that the empanelled Hospitals have been refusing cashless medical treatment because their bills have not been defrayed. Thus, the retired employees of M.C.D have been tied hand and foot and left at the crossroads by the Corporations. They are neither given pension nor cashless medical treatment. During this pandemic some of them have died due to non-availability of immediate medical treatment. This act on the part of the M.C.Ds is extremely cruel and unbecoming of an ideal employer.

- 8. That the retired teachers of North DMC are particularly facing immense problems in meeting their daily expenses. Some of them have medical problems, which require urgent treatment and care. These employees do not have any other source of livelihood other than their pension and the facility of cashless medical treatment. But, they are denied even this bare minimum. In legal terms the act of the M.C.D amounts to an act of fraud and criminal breach of trust.
- 9. That the issues involved in the present case are common to all retired teachers working under the North, South & East DMCs and therefore, individual teachers who are quite large in number have not been individually made parties to the present petition. Besides, this Hon'ble Court is already seized of the issue regarding payment of salary to the teachers and pension of retired employees of M.C.D in W.P.(C) No.3833/2020, 5033/2020, 533/2020 and 6532/2020.

10. **GROUNDS**

- I. Because the act of the MCD in not providing cashless medical facilities to the retired employees despite collecting the premium amount from them is not only the breach of their fundamental right to life but also a criminal act of fraud and breach of trust. These retired employees are denied pension on time and also medical treatment in need. The act of the M.C.D is extremely cruel and inhuman.
- II. Because denial of pension and cashless medical facility to the teachers and other employees by the respondents has caused immense problems not only for them but for their dependants as well. They are faced with the situation of starvation. They cannot get proper treatment for themselves or their dependants. In Harjinder Singh Vs Punjab State ware housing corporation (2010) 3SCC, 192, the Hon'ble Supreme Court held that if a man is deprived of his livelihood, he is deprived of all his fundamental/constitutional rights. Denial of salary/pension and cashless medical services to teachers and other employees in the present case has taken away all their rights.
- III. Because a common order on the issue involved in the case will check proliferation of litigation.
- 11. That no petition likes the present one is pending adjudication before this Hon'ble Court or any other court.
- 12. That the petitioners do not have any other adequate efficacious remedy.

PRAYER

It is, therefore, most respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble Court may graciously be pleased to;

i. issue an appropriate writ/order/direction in the nature of mandamus directing the respondents to provide cashless medical services to the retired teachers and employees of three MCDs namely South, North and East, who have deposited the subscription fees for the purpose and further direction to the respondents to reimburse the medical bills of the retired employees on account of medical treatment without delay.

AND/OR

ii. pass such other order/s as may be deemed fit and proper.

AND FOR THIS ACT OF KINDNESS THE PETITIONERS AS IN DUTY BOUND SHALL EVER PRAY.

Akhil Dilli Prathmik Shikshak Sangh (ADPSS) is an organization of about 25000 Primary Teachers from the schools run by various local bodies and Government of Delhi. ADPSS is affiliated to All India Primary Teachers, AIPTF is further affiliated with Education International, an organization of about 3 crore teachers from 171 countries.

Your kind attention is drawn towards the pending arrear bills of North Delhi Municipal Corporation School teachers which are still pending since past 5 years. These arrear bills are related to MACP, Children Education Allowances, Bonus, Medical Reimbursement, LTC and GPF advances. Presently the teachers of North MCD have not been paid their salaries since October 2019. Besides this, teachers have never been paid their salaries on time since past 5 years. The retired teachers have also not been receiving pension on time for the last five years. Even the arrears of the benefits of the VIIth Pay Commission have not been released to the teachers and the pensioners. All three Corporations have collected subscription for providing

cashless medical treatment to the retired employees but such facility is not provided actually. As a result, retired teachers and employees of MCD run from pillar to post for medical treatment and reimbursement of bills takes months and in some cases even years. If the cashless medical treatment as promised by the MCD will solve the problem of the retired employees.

You are requested to personally look into the matter and direct the concerned authorities for releasing the salary/pension on last day of every month and clear all pending bills at earliest. You are further requested to ensure that the approved/empanelled Hospitals provide cashless medical treatment to the retired teachers/employees.

We shall be thankful to you for your kind initiative for the welfare of teachers of the Corporations.


