The instant PIL is being filed with a prayer to delete a scene from movie called "JAYESHBHAI JORDAR" which is based on the Female Foeticide theme and trying to promote the cause of Save Girl Child, which is need of the hour but the issue which is being raised after seeing trailer of the movie which is of 2 mins 57 second and scene at 1 min 10th second shows;

"shows the use of Ultrasound technology in a clinic to determine the sex of the foetus and abortion technique in case of girl child"

The PC & PNDT Act as per section 3, 3A, 3B, 4, 6 & 22 of the PC & PNDT Act squarely restrict the advertisement of ultrasound technique for sex determination and the objective of the act also negate such practises, what is being contested is only deletion of the clinic scene and promotion of the ultrasound technique"

A pregnant woman sits alone with her thoughts inside the cold, empty hospital consultation room in India. She simply wants to make sure her baby is okay, but in the back of her mind, she knows there is a lot riding on whether the baby is a boy or girl. She knows it is illegal to ask the doctor to disclose information about the sex of her baby, but is desperate to please her husband and in-laws with the news of a son.

Sex Selective abortions, also known as female feticides, occur when female fetuses are aborted due to a cultural preference for sons. In India, the cause for female feticide is the overwhelming belief that women have less societal value than men. A lack of education among women, insufficient female leadership, and negative perceptions of women as "economic burdens" contribute to this view.

When girls are married, their parents are expected to pay a "dowry" to the groom's family, which is essentially a payment in cash, food, household items, and clothes "Dowries are not necessarily called

'dowries,' but sometimes they are called 'gifts,' and that there are many other nomenclatures and euphemisms for them." Once married, daughters are expected to take their husbands' last name and move in with their family to begin their role within the home. As a result, young girls are often not well-informed, confident, or financially independent enough to make educated decisions about pregnancy and children. Abortion is legal in India, but sex-selective abortions, abortions solely based on the sex of the fetus, are illegal.

We have law in place to control the above position also there are various landmark judgements of the Hon'ble Supreme Court on this subject matter; but the distant reality is still far away; Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act, 1994 is an Act of the Parliament of India sanctioned to stop female foeticides and capture the declining sex ratio in India. The act restricted pre-birth sex assurance. Each hereditary advising focus group, hereditary research center or a hereditary facility offering pre-natal diagnostics methods, such as In Vitro Fertilization (IVF) with the capability of sex choice (Pre-implantation hereditary

finding) follows the mandate of the PC-PNDT Act, 2003 and are prohibited.

Hence the instant Writ Petition praying for directions to Respondent to delete the clinic scene from the movie Jayeshbhai Jordar which tends to defeat the objective of the PC& PNDT Act.

THE HUMBLE PETITION OF THE PETITIONER ABOVE NAMED.

Most respectfully submitted;

1. That the petitioner is a registered NGO under the Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 having registration No. 575/2015-16 on 18.06.2015 and where as the petitioner is being represented through the President, Dr. Manish Jain who is registered medical practitioner in state of Delhi NCR and also a law abiding citizen of India. That petitioner has no personal interest in the litigation and that the petition is not guided by self-gain or for gain of any other person/institution/body and that there is no motive other than of public interest in filing the writ petition and if any cost imposed same will borne by the petitioner, also there is no criminal antecedents and similar petition filed by the petitioner

herein. Copy of the Registration certificate of the Petitioner NGO is annexed as **Annexure P-1**.

2. That the instant PIL is being motivated to file after seeing the official trailer of the movie which is being released on the YOU TUBE by the respondent no. 04 which is private entity and the you tube link for the record purpose is;

https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=fppJtxJ7RWY

3. That the Female foeticide is the procedure of determining the gender of a foetus and aborting it if it is a girl. Despite the fact that it is illegal, many people continue to do so. Aside from that, certain societies practise female infanticide, which is the death of a girl child after she is born. Census 2001 statistics suggest that there are only 933 women for every 1000 men in the country, highlighting this reality and it is because in large public interest this PIL is being filed to save the fundamental right of the women's particularly right to life under Article 21 of the Constitution of India.

- 4. That the respondent No. 1 and 2 are the concerned authority formed under the PC & PNDT Act to implement the objective of the Act and whereas the Respondent No. 03 is Film certification body against which the relief is being claimed and whereas Respondent No. 04 is private entity who has produced this Film "JAYESHBHAI JORDAR".
- 5. That as per the statistical report of Respondent No. 01 In 2020, the sex ratio of the total population in India is 108.18 males per 100 females. There are 717,100,970 or 717.10 million males and 662,903,415 or 662.90 million females in India. The percentage of the female population is 48.04 percent compared to 51.96 percent male population. India has the highest numbers of exceed males population of 54.20 million. India is at 189th position out of 201 countries/territories in terms of female to male ratio. Among Asian countries, its position is 42nd out of 51 countries/territories.
- **6.** That as per the Annual report by Ministry of Women & Child Development for year 2020-2021 The multi-

sectoral intervention Districts laid emphasis on and advocacy & launched focused awareness changing mindsets, for campaigns for effective enforcement of Pre-Conception & Pre Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PC&PNDT) Act and enabling girls' education amongst other things. The districts have introduced interventions mainly towards engaging communities, improvement in Sex Ratio at Birth, promoting institutional deliveries, maintaining village level record of birth and their exhibition in public Gudda places through Guddi Boards, birth registration, encouraging celebration of girl child, challenging soncentric rituals and reversing the social norms, re-enrollment drives for getting girls back to schools and other initiatives for valuing of girl child. Copy of the Annual Report is Annexed as **Annexure P**-2.

7. The Government has adopted a multi-pronged strategy including schemes and programmes and awareness generation/advocacy measures to build a positive environment for the girl child through gender sensitive

policies, provisions and legislation. The measures include the following:-

Intensified effective implementation of the Pre-Pre-natal Diagnostic Techniques conception and (Prohibition of Sex Selection) Act, 1994 and amended various provisions of the Rules, viz. programme review at the state level. Five regional review workshops for North, West, central, north east and Southern regions were organized at Srinagar, Pune, Hyderabad, Kolkata and Bhopal during 2013-14 to evaluate and review the progress of implementation of the PC&PNDT Act, 1994 in the country. During the current financial year 2014-15, four review workshops for North, West, north east and Southern regions were organized.

The Government provides financial support to the States and UTs for operationalization of PNDT Cells, Capacity Building, Orientation & Sensitization Workshop, Information, Education and Communication campaigns and for strengthening structures for the

implementation of the PC & PNDT Act, 1994 under the National Health Mission (NHM).

- The Minister of Health and Family Welfare has requested all the State Governments to strengthen implementation of the Act and to ensure timely steps to stop illegal sex determination.
- Directions given vide Order dated 04.03.2013 by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the matter of WP(C) 349/2006 were communicated to the States/ UTs at the level of Health Minister to Chief Ministers and Chief Secretaries to ensure immediate compliance.
- Inspections by the National Inspection and Monitoring Committee (NIMC) have been scaled up. In year 2014-15, 16 inspection visits were undertaken in the States of Madhya Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Andhra Pradesh, Himachal Pradesh, Karnataka, Uttar Pradesh, Odisha, West Bengal, Delhi (Twice), Chhattisgarh, Bihar, Manipur, Jharkhand, Tamilnadu and Gujarat.

States have been advised to focus on Districts/Blocks/Villages with low Child Sex Ratio to ascertain the causes, plan appropriate Behaviour Change Communication campaigns and effectively implement provisions of the PC & PNDT Act, 1994.

The Central Supervisory Board (CSB) was constituted by the government under Section 7 of the Pre-conception and Pre-natal Diagnostic Techniques (Prohibition of Sex Selection) Act, 1994, with the mandate to review and monitor implementation of the Act and rules made there under. A total of 22 meetings of the CSB were held since inception of the Act to review the implementation of the Act.

As per Reports submitted by States/ UTs, a total number of 206 convictions have so far been secured under the Act. The year-wise details of conviction, maintained since 2009 and the details of total conviction as furnished by States/UTs are given below:-

- 9. That even after strict laws and it's implementation position has not changed much, certainly it has improved but there are various factors promoting the sex selection methods with the young married couples and family.
- 10. That the instant public interest litigation is being in view of the above subject matter and one of the factor due to which the conditions have not improved much is readily available first hand information to the citizens and wee see in the movie JAYESHBHAI JORDAR trailer that one of the scene in which the couple and his family member gone for the sex selection in Ultrasound clinic and Doctor is operating the machine and showing the radiology image of the baby in womb of the mother and on being asked by the family member, Agar Ladka hua toh Jai Shree Krishna and Ladkee hue toh JAI MATA Dii followed by abortion of the girl child.

- 11. That the trailer of the movie is showing the struggle of the couple who is willing to readily accept the baby be it boy or girl and it depicts that they are promoting the gender equality and showing this taboo of female foeticide to the public in large which is the instant reality of our society and we really appreciate that such issue is being raised and awareness is being created among public but problem arises is with the ultrasound clinic scene where the technology of ultrasound for sex selection is being advertised openly without censor and as per section 3, 3A, 3B, 4, 6 & 22 of the PC & PNDT Act, same is not allowed & hence the instant PIL. Copy of the representation served upon the respondent is annexed as Annexure P-3.
- 12. That the instant petition is being filed with the sole objective of effective implementation of the PC& PNDT Act with prayer to stop all forms of promotion of sex selection & it's technique; and for perusal of this Hon'ble Court operative potion of the Act is reproduced below;

An Act to provide for the prohibition of sex selection, before or after conception, and for regulation of prenatal diagnostic techniques for the purposes of detecting genetic abnormalities or metabolic disorders or chromosomal abnormalities or certain congenital malformations or sex-linked disorders and for the prevention of their misuse for sex determination leading to female foeticide; and, for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

(i) pre-natal diagnostic procedures means all gynaecological or obstetrical or medical procedures such as ultrasonography, foetoscopy, taking or removing samples of amniotic fluid, chorionic villi, blood or any other tissue or fluid of a man, or of a woman for being sent to a Genetic Laboratory or Genetic Clinic for conducting any type of analysis or pre-natal diagnostic tests for selection of sex before or after conception;

- (j) "pre-natal diagnostic techniques" includes all prenatal diagnostic procedures and pre-natal diagnostic tests;
- (k) "pre-natal diagnostic test" means ultrasonography or any test or analysis of amniotic fluid, chorionic villi, blood or any tissue or fluid of a pregnant woman or conceptus conducted to detect genetic or metabolic disorders or chromosomal abnormalities or congenital anomalies or haemoglobinopathies or sex-linked diseases;
- (o) "sex selection" includes any procedure, technique, test or administration or prescription or provision of anything for the purpose of ensuring or increasing the probability that an embryo will be of a particular sex;

Regulation of Genetic Counselling Centres, Genetic Laboratories and Genetic Clinics.-

On and from the commencement of this Act,— 1. no Genetic Counselling Centre, Genetic Laboratory or Genetic Clinic unless registered under this Act, shall

conduct or associate with, or help in, conducting activities relating to prenatal diagnostic techniques;

- 2. no Genetic Counselling Centre or Genetic Laboratory or Genetic Clinic shall employ or cause to be employed or take services of any person, whether on honorary basis or on payment who does not possess qualifications as may be prescribed;
- 3. no medical geneticist, gynaecologist, paediatrician, registered medical practitioner or any other person shall conduct or cause to be conducted or aid in conducting by himself or through any other person, any pre-natal diagnostic techniques at a place other than a place registered under this Act.
- 3A. Prohibition of sex-selection- No person, including a specialist or a team of specialists in the field of infertility, shall conduct or cause to be conducted or aid in conducting by himself or by any other person, sex selection on a woman or a man or on both or on any tissue, embryo, conceptus, fluid or gametes derived from either or both of them.

3B. Prohibition on sale of ultrasound machines, etc., to persons, laboratories, clinics, etc. not registered under the Act.- No person shall sell any ultrasound machine or imaging machine or scanner or any other equipment capable of detecting sex of foetus to any Genetic Counselling Centre, Genetic Laboratory, Genetic Clinic or any other person not registered under the Act.

22. Prohibition of advertisement relating to pre-natal determination of sex and punishment contravention.- 1. No person, organization, Genetic Counselling Centre, Genetic Laboratory or Genetic Clinic, including clinic, laboratory or centre having ultrasound machine or imaging machine or scanner or technology capable of undertaking any other determination of sex of foetus or sex selection shall issue, publish, distribute, communicate or cause to be issued, published, distributed or communicated any advertisement, in any form, including internet, regarding facilities of pre-natal determination of sex or sex selection before conception available at such

centre, laboratory, clinic or at any other place. 2. No person or organization including Genetic Counselling Centre, Genetic Laboratory or Genetic Clinic shall issue, publish, distribute, communicate or cause to be issued, published, distributed or communicated any advertisement in any manner regarding pre-natal determination or preconception selection of sex by any means whatsoever, scientific or otherwise. 3. Any person who contravenes the provisions of sub-section (1) or sub-section (2) shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years and with fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees. Explanation.—For the purposes of this section, "advertisement" includes any notice, circular, label, other document including wrapper or any advertisement through internet or any other media in electronic or print form and also includes any visible representation made by means of any hoarding, wallpainting, signal, light, sound, smoke or gas.

- 13. That the Hon'ble Supreme Court in various landmark judgements upon the PC & PNDT Act, retreated the objective of the Act and its progressive interpretation to achieve the ends results. In following landmark matters the above is upheld;

 - 2. Centre for Enquiry into Health and Allied The emes (CEHAT) v. Union of India.
 - 3. Ajit Savant Majagvai v. State of Karnataka.

Vikas Yadav v. State of Uttar Pradesh & others10, while dealing with honour killing.

Child Protection and Welfare

B. Initiative with NIMHANS:

4.32 Ministry has signed an MOU with NIMHANS to establish a National Initiative & Integrated Resource Centre for Child Protection. Mental Health, and Psychosocial Care in NIMHANS. The initiative has been named as SAMVAD .An amount of Rs.5, 19, 11,160/-(out of total demand of Rs. 10, 38, 22, 320/-) has been released to NIMHANS for the initiative SAMVAD during the current F.Y. i.e. 2020-21, as of now. SAMVAD started functioning in June 2020. It is working in 4 key thematic areas, namely Mental Health, Care & Protection, Education and Policy & Law. During this initial period, the Initiative has reached out to a total of 44,285 persons in 18 states through various training and capacity building programs and/or public discourse series conducted via Virtual Knowledge Network Systems, wherein multinode video conferencing technology has been used to adapt in-person creative and participatory pedagogical methods for online deliverables.

C. Collaboration with LBSNAA for capacity building:

4.33 The Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration (LBSNAA) in partnership with the Ministry of Women & Child Development (MWCD) is working on an initiative for capacity building of multiple stakeholders for strengthening implementation of the Juvenile Justice Act in India starting with a pilot project in Uttarakhand, which will gradually be scaled up for implementation in other states. In this context, National Gender Centre (NGC) under LBSNAA is developing modules (both online and offline) on Children's Rights with a special focus on Juvenile Justice Act.

D. National Child Protection Policy:

4.34 In pursuance with the direction of

the Hon'ble Supreme Court in the Matter of Sampoorna Behrua vs. UOI &Ors (M.A. No.-2069/2018 in W.P.(C) No.473/2005 regarding drafting of a National Child Protection Policy, draft National Child Protection Policy has been prepared by the Ministry of Women and Child Development which is expected to be finalized shortly.

E. Persons with disability:

4.35 This Ministry assists 5408 Special Need Children in 152 Children Homes in States/ UTs under Child Protection Services (CPS) Scheme.

III. GIRL CHILD: BETI BACHAO BETI PADHAO

Beti Bachao Beti Padhao Scheme (Celebrate Girl Child, Enable her Education) was launched on 22nd January, 2015 at Panipat, Haryana to address the declining Child Sex Ratio (CSR). The CSR, defined as number of girls per 1000 boys in the age group of 0-6 years, declined sharply from 976 in 1961 to 918 in Census 2011. This is a tri-ministerial initiative of Ministries of Women and Child Development, Health & Family Welfare and Education with a focus on awareness and advocacy campaign for changing mindsets, multi-sectoral action in select districts, enabling girls education and effective enforcement of Pre-Conception & Pre Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PC&PNDT) Act.

A. Objectives:

- i To prevent gender biased sex selective elimination.
- ii To ensure survival and protection of the girl child, building value of girl child.
- iii To ensure education and participation of the girl child.

C. Scheme has two major components:

i Advocacy and Media campaign:

4.37 To sensitize the masses and for changing mindset, Nation-wide media campaign (360 degree approach) is being implemented which among others include radio spots/jingles in Hindi and regional languages, video spots, SMS campaigns, community engagement through mobile exhibition vans, and field publicity Mailers, Hand-outs, Brochures and other information education communication material in English, Hindi and regional languages has been adopted which includes social media platforms. All 640 Districts (as per census 2011) are covered through media advocacy and outreach.

ii Multi-sectoral intervention:

4.38 Out of 640 Districts (as per Census 2011), **405 districts** are covered under multisectoral intervention. A flexible framework has been adopted and contextualized by District Task Forces for developing, implementing and monitoring District Plans of Action to achieve the Monitorable Targets.

D. Coverage of Scheme:

4.39 Beti Bachao Beti Padhao (BBBP) is being implemented in All India and covering 640

districts (as per Census 2011) across the country. Out of 640 districts, **405 districts** are covered under multi-sectoral intervention along with Media Advocacy under direct supervision of DMs/DCs and all 640 **districts** are covered through advocacy & media campaign. BBBP Scheme is a 100% funded by the Central Government and funds are directly transferred to designated BBBP account of selected districts under multi-sectoral intervention. The District collectors/ Deputy Commissioners is leading the implementation of BBBP Scheme at district level. The phases of expansion of BBBP Scheme;

E. Monitoring mechanisms:

4.40 At the Central level, Ministry of Women and Child Development is the nodal ministry for implementation of this Scheme. A strong monitoring mechanism has been established at National, State/UT and District level. A National Task Force (NTF) at National level headed by Secretary, MWCD, State Task Force (STF) headed by Chief Secretary/UT Administrator at State/UT level and DTF (District Task Force) headed by DCs/DMs at District level to guide, monitor and review the progress of intermediary targets of the Scheme.

4.41 The status of fund under BBBP is as follows:


4.42 Districts implementing multi sectoral intervention under **BBBP** Scheme reported that during the financial year 2019-3102 convergence meetings held with the line department and various stakeholders, conducted 6374 media campaign for spreading awareness; 1845 training programme organised at District level with various stakeholders and 2,10,863 participants were oriented & sensitized: 52,240 training organised for ASHA, Aganwadi workers and build the capacities of 6,42,017 workers; 5,81,410 awareness activities oragnised through various mode such as Nuked Natak, puppet shows, magic shows, street plays, community meetings etc.

G. Achievements so far:

4.43 Scheme has stirred up collective consciousness towards changing the mindset of

the Nation towards valuing the girl child. It has resulted in increased awareness, sensitization and conscious building around the issue of declining CSR in across the country. As a result, a favourable trend with concerted efforts at National, State and District levels has been seen in Sex Ratio of Birth (SRB) at State/UT level. Improving trend of 3 points observed is Sex Ratio at Birth (SRB) at National level from 931 (2018-19) to 934 (2019-20), as per HMIS, of MH&FW.

4.44 The multisectoral intervention Districts laid emphasis on awareness and advocacy & launched focused campaigns for changing mindsets, for effective enforcement of Pre-Conception & Pre Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PC&PNDT) Act and enabling girls' education amongst other things. The districts have introduced interventions mainly towards engaging communities, improvement in Sex Ratio at Birth, promoting institutional deliveries, maintaining village level record of birth and their exhibition in public places through Guddi Gudda Boards, birth registration, encouraging celebration of girl child, challenging soncentric rituals and reversing the social norms, re-enrollment drives for getting girls back to schools and other initiatives for valuing of girl child. Some of the good initiatives taken by Districts are seen at Annexure-XXV.


